9. ESG Fiduciary Update	Working on ESG CV funding in MATTS system and it will be gone. Working on for FY22 completion. Application due on June 2 for ESG FY222/23. COC applications will be decided and ranked in the coming months. To be discussed.	
9. HMIS Lead Agency Update	Submitted PIT and HIUC. Prepping for new HUD data standards, changes and how to incorporate those in data and workflows. Looking for HMIS fiduciary to oversee HMIS grant. Currently MSHDA is acting in this capacity. What is max number of licenses in Macomb? Process to have more folks licensed in Macomb.	
10. Old Business	Macomb CoC Board elections: Board members elected: Connie Lasher, Pastor Lew Stier, Sarah Gilstorf, Monisha Scott, Gail Harding, Victoria Rines. Officers elected: Julie Hintz, President, Lisa Chapman, Secretary	
11. New Business	Presentation from <b>AnneMarie Carful from PACE</b> —senior (55 and older) waiver program, Medicare and Medicaid funding. Free program, no co-pays. Day centers with medical clinic (Henry Ford system). Cover entire SEMI area- called PACE SEMI. Therapy provided without caps. Goal of program is to keep folks out of nursing home until end of life. New center opening at Hall Rd. and Romeo plank- opening in June. Able to do tours once it opens. Must qualify for Medicaid to be in program- income based, there is an asset test. Can be private pay too (5k per month roughly). Homeless persons in shelter wouldn't qualify, but temp/transitional program could. Help with the Medicaid application if folks don't have it yet. St. Clair county has own PACE- Sunshine PACE. Asked about the PACE program that the housing agent could give out to the applicants on the PACE program. VA benefits do not coordinate, VA benefits would be higher than the asset test. Will send out the materials from PACE to	

the entire. Also going into the nursing homes and doing presentations. Presentation from Monisha Scott- John D. Dingell VA Medical Center, Homeless Veteran Updates- update on VB services at the VCRRC- staff accepted a new position so there is no one there to complete applications, so apps are on hold until they can get a new staff. Vets can come to the VCRRC and drop in -use the services there.
Szjyna and Assoc. Doing HCV waitlist pulls. Doing pulls and getting vouchers issued within 45 days. Having trouble to prove residency for the HCV at the time of pull. Could use license/state ID, DHHS print out, voter registration ID card, Medicare/Medicaid program, shelter verification- have to work to get folks ready sooner. Need help to talk to them to let them know what needs to be done. Success rate in Macomb in finding people is not as high- have to deactivate 75% of names from pulls. Emergency contact info also can be filled in at the time of the application. Issue of need for verification of county of residence and also homelessness. Change ID to location (could use shelter address and this is enough to prove residency for HCV). Have to be living or working in the county at time of HCV pull. If still on the
homeless waitlist (recert within 120 days) can be doubled up with mom or sharing a place within the county, they would be ok. Need to have their ID reflect Macomb address. Between when they leave shelter and 120 day when the have to recertify, issue is who can verify. Self certification is not acceptable. Should be working with a service provider and putting case notes into HMIS for homeless preference to verify homelessness and also have to verify residency for county. PATH can verify unsheltered person homelessness and residency. Comment made about unsheltered folks and need for additional outreach services by Gail Marlow- outside of PATH and MCMM, no other resources currently. MCA is going out weekly and Communities First health going out on weekly also.
Winter shelter stats- individual 558 different people- avg 76 per night- (98 in March) open Dec-March highest were 116 one night. 475 provided direct assist. SUD svs 73. 112 to temp or PH. 89 Macomb county applications. 48% age 55- 61. 70% male. 10 difference counties. Guests from 9 different states. Was very successful, number of churches helped host. Rotating was good but once had permanent church location worked better. Can send volunteers over to help with check in at 7, serving meals or staying overnight. Funding was very helpful- county helped with one-time assistance in funding. Possibly use United Way funding, Gail applying for grants, possibly ESG \$ (could also help with HMIS data entry). Want to provide more services like CSM, mental health and other services.

Getting WAVE project to have folks able to shower, clothing, MCA, CMH 2x month, SSA and others. Can pick people up if need be to get them there.
